



Beautify, add fun and visual interest, make Cedar Rapids stand out.


I think art should enhance the space. Be beautiful, vibrant, multicultural! And ART. I do not appreciate controversial art, abstract art, or political art.





Something in the river ... possibly depicting flood levels I'd like to see the trails as untouched as possible but also celebrated in the urban areas.





Rating of Current Cedar Rapids Public Art





99 Responses

I'd like it to feel like the city has a personality - like public art might reflect aspects of that personality, and one might see art elsewhere and feel like it resonates with that personality.

I think it is important to make our gateways to the city welcoming. The marriage of art and landscaping is most desirable. Our landscaping ordinances should include retrofits for all neighborhoods and commercial areas.

Be sure to include information about how 'regular' people can be involved.

Cedar rapids has been a destination for many immigrant communities, I would like to see that reflected in future art projects. And not just the Czech/Bohemian. I would like to see African, Asian, Indian among other ethnic backgrounds represented.

I want art to be something EVERYONE would like to see. I don't want to see something to promote a social agenda.

Celebrate Cedar Rapids as the great city that it is and has become. Use the art tastefully to appeal to the family friendly majority of the people who live and work here ... nature, history, family.

Make sure art is accessible to those with disabilities and a variety of disabilities (not just mobile disabilities) - universal design and LEED or environmental design.
